ACADEMIC SUPPLIES CHECKLIST—Please <u>label</u> all <u>personal materials</u> with your name! So many supplies are lost and unclaimed each year because we don't know who owns them—what a sad waste of materials and resources! ®

- 1. Lots and lots of **#2 pencils** (or many mechanical pencils with lead refillsthe ones that do not need sharpening! Mrs. Newton <u>highly</u> recommends these!)
- 2. **Erasers**—lots and lots of erasers (especially cap erasers for pencil tops!)
- 3. **Pens**--for correcting work in class
- 4. Pencil case or pouch
- 5. Highlighters
- 6. Rosary
- 7. *THREE or FOUR boxes of Kleenex—no need to label with name
- 8. *THREE or FOUR rolls of paper towels—no need to label with name
- 9. *THREE or FOUR large containers of Lysol/Clorox sanitizing wipes—no need to label with name
- 10. *FOUR containers of Wet Wipes/Baby Wipes (which can be used for faces, hands, and desks—in that order—when we have food in the classroom! ©)
- 11. Pencil sharpener (<u>to be kept at HOME</u>...all pencils need to be sharpened each night. If this is a problem, I strongly suggest mechanical pencils!) However, you may want a <u>small hand sharpener</u> to be used for your colored pencils at school.
- 12. One package of wide rule loose leaf notebook paper—no need to label with name.
- 13. **Graph paper**—for math—one package
- 14. **One 2" Binder for Writing**—color and style of your choice. We will use the binders for our 5th Grade Writing Portfolios.
- 15. **5 Spiral Notebooks**—wide-ruled
- 16. Accordion file organizer with 13 file slots—color and style of your choice

You will need to remember details because I am going to ask you to give a short "book talk" about one of the student choice books on your book list--this will be your first Reading grade of the year. The other book required for summer reading is The Lemonade War and it is listed on the following form. Be sure to highlight any new or interesting vocabulary words as you go along! I do not want this to be a stressful assignment—I simply want you to read books for the pure enjoyment of reading, because reading is fun! ©

This summer, please be sure to practice addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division math facts. You need to test your own math facts skills because it is very hard to do fifth grade math if you don't know your basic facts quickly and accurately. There are so many resources on-line to help with this drill and practice. Make it a game and have fun learning your math facts! ©

Mrs. Newton's best advice: know your math facts well so that math will be easy! ©
