
Academic Achievement Program Procedures

- 1. Classroom teacher or parent identifies an ongoing student concern that is impacting their academic achievement.
- 2. Classroom teacher partners with Academic Achievement Program Teacher (AAPT) to identify 2-3 classroom interventions by grade-level that can be implemented to assist student for a period of 3 weeks consistently. See *Classroom Intervention Checklist* for grades K-5, 6-8, 9-12 to select appropriate interventions.
- 3. Classroom teacher will collect data (student samples, progress monitoring, observations, etc.) to determine the effect of the interventions implemented to address the student concerns over the 3 weeks. Members of the AAT may support the monitoring and collection of data.
- 4. After 3 weeks follow pathway below based upon student's response to interventions. When appropriate access *Academic Achievement Team Initial Referral Procedures*.



5. Student response to interventions will determine the next step for the AAT. Student may be referred to physician or for Psychological-Education Evaluation. The AAT and

- administration will be responsible for supporting and guiding families to the appropriate resources.
- 6. If a student progresses through the referral process and it is determined, they require an *Academic Achievement Plan* (physician or Psychological-Education Evaluation diagnosis) the AAT will follow the *Academic Achievement Plan Procedures*.
